Catholic Pilgrimage Sites

Mother Cabrini Shrine

Mother Cabrini Shrine located beyond the foothills of Golden, Colorado, was established by Saint Frances Xavier Cabrini, the first American citizen to be canonized a saint. The shrine site began as a summer camp for orphan children and for the purpose of spreading the gospel. With her beatification in 1938, the property became a place of prayer, pilgrimage and devotion to Mother Cabrini and the Sacred Heart of Jesus. There is a 22-foot statue of Jesus that awaits you after a gradual climb of 373 steps.

Mother Cabrini Shrine has been designated as a Denver Archdiocesan Pilgrimage Site for the Year of Mercy. On Sunday, December 13, the Holy Doors of the chapel were decorated, blessed and opened. Chapel on the Rock (St. Catherine of Siena Chapel)

Each year, thousands of people make their way to Allenspark, Colorado (near Estes Park) to visit the Chapel. Pope John Paul II prayed at the chapel during his visit to Denver for World Youth Day in 1993; he blessed the chapel afterwards. Even after a fire destroyed the majority of the St. Malo Retreat Center in 2011 the Chapel on the Rock remained open. In 2013, a massive flood and landslide took out thousands of trees and rendered much of the site unusable. Still the Chapel stands as an eloquent symbol of God's enduring love and mercy.

Outdoor Adventures

Red Rocks Park and Amphitheater

Nestled in the Rocky Mountain Foothills fifteen miles west of Denver, Red Rocks is a geologically formed, open-air amphitheater that is not duplicated anywhere in the world. The majestic setting of the world-famous concert venue, along with the panoramic view of Denver, makes for a breathtaking scene. At an elevation of 6,200 feet above sea level, this diverse environment allows the visitor to see plants, birds and animals of the Great Plains and Rocky Mountains. The Visitor Center provides guests with an amazing performer's hall of fame display, an interactive educational display featuring the geologic and musical history of Red Rocks. The park is open 5 a.m. to 11 p.m. daily, free of charge. On event days, tourists are permitted until 5 p.m. for more information go to:

Mount Evans

Mount Evans is the road into the sky. Drive from 8,700 feet at Idaho Springs just off Interstate 70 up to 14,240 feet to the summit. You will pass through 3 life zones, passing ancient trees, lakes and forest to the land above timberline. It can be 90 degrees in Denver and 40 degrees at the top of Mount Evans. Mountain goats and bighorn sheep may greet you as you climb to the top of the world. All 14 miles of the road from the entrance station to the Mount Evans summit parking area (14,130) are paved. From there, you can hike the last 130 feet (about 1/4 mile walk) to the top at 14,264 feet. After you have made this climb, you can tell all your friends: "I climbed a 14,000-foot mountain in Colorado!" There is a park fee per vehicle. For details go to:

Rocky Mountain National Park & Estes Park

Estes Park is located on Highway 36 about 20 miles west of Boulder. The town of Estes Park has quaint shops and restaurants and is very pedestrian friendly. Estes Park is the east entrance of Rocky Mountain National Park, the third most visited National Park in the U.S. and home of some of the highest peaks in the Rockies. Inside the park follows Trail Ridge Rd., which climbs over 12,000 feet

with mountain views all around. The park also boasts over 300 miles of walking trails. Day passes can be purchased per automobile or per person. For more information go to: <http://www.nps.gov/romo>

Garden of the Gods Nature Center

The Garden of the Gods is located near Colorado Springs, south of Denver on Interstate 25. This park has towering sandstone rock formations against the backdrop of Pikes Peak. Admission is free!
