Nota Bene for 2023 Liturgical Calendar

- Anticipatory Masses said before 4:00 PM do not fulfill the Holy Day/Sunday Obligation 1
- Observance of the Solemnity of the Ascension of the Lord is transferred to the Seventh Sunday of Easter, May 21, 2023.
- "The entire celebration of the Easter Vigil takes place at night. It should not begin before nightfall; it should end before daybreak on Sunday" (Roman Missal). On April 8, 2023 according to United States Naval Observatory Sun and Moon Data, civil twilight in Denver ends at 7:58 PM (MDT). The Easter Vigil should not begin until 8:00 PM

¹ Universal Norms on the Liturgical Year and the General Roman Calendar nos. 3 and 11. Each and every day is sanctified by the liturgical celebrations of the People of God, especially by the Eucharistic Sacrifice and the Divine Office. The liturgical day runs from midnight to midnight. However, the celebration of Sunday and of Solemnities begins already on the evening of the previous day.

<u>December 2023 Calendar Advisory</u>

DECEMBER 24-25 (Fourth Sunday of Advent and Christmas)

The Solemnity of the Nativity of the Lord (Christmas) falls this year on a Monday. Questions may arise as to what to celebrate on the evening of December 24, as both days are Holy Days of Obligation. As the celebration of the Nativity of the Lord ranks higher on the Table of Liturgical Days, Masses celebrated on the evening of December 24 are those of the Nativity and Evening Prayer II of the Nativity is prayed.

On a separate note, even though the Mass celebrated on Sunday Evening of December 24 will be the Mass of Christmas, it may fulfill the Mass obligation for either Christmas or Sunday but cannot fulfill both obligations simultaneously. The fulfillment of each obligation requires the attendance of a Mass either on that day or the evening prior.
