

Liturgical Calendar 2025

Catholics are obliged to attend Holy Mass on Sundays and the following holy days of obligation:

Wednesday	January 1, 2025	Solemnity - Mary, the Mother of God
Friday	August 15, 2025	Solemnity - Assumption of the BVM
Monday	December 8, 2025	Solemnity – Immaculate Conception
Thursday	December 25, 2025	Solemnity - Nativity of Our Lord

Nota Bene for 2025 Liturgical Calendar

- Anticipatory Masses said before 4:00 PM do not fulfill the Holy Day/Sunday Obligation.
- As November 1, 2025, the Solemnity of All Saints, falls on a Saturday, the obligation to attend Mass has been abrogated by the US Bishops.
- "The entire celebration of the Easter Vigil takes place at night. It should not begin before nightfall; it should end before daybreak on Sunday" (Roman Missal). On April 19, 2025 according to United States Naval Observatory Sun and Moon Data, civil twilight in Denver ends at 8:10 PM (MDT). The Easter Vigil should not begin until 8:15 PM
- Observance of the Solemnity of the Ascension of the Lord is transferred to the Seventh Sunday of Easter, June 1, 2025.
- In a notification from the Congregation for Divine Worship and the Discipline of the Sacraments (Prot. n. 2671/98/L) from 1998, the Obligatory Memorial of the Immaculate Heart of the BVM becomes an Optional Memorial in years when it conflicts with another Obligatory Memorial. Therefore, Saturday, June 28, 2025 will be a weekday in Ordinary Time, as well as the Optional Memorials of the Immaculate Heart of the BVM and Saint Irenaeus, Bishop, Martyr, and Doctor.

Local Celebrations proper to each individual church

Each individual church celebrates the Title of the Church and the Anniversary of the Dedication of the Church as a solemnity unless that day is occupied by a higher ranked day in the Table of Liturgical Days. During Ordinary Time, these celebrations may optionally be transferred to the nearest Sunday, unless a higher ranked solemnity happens to occupy that Sunday.

December 2024 Calendar Advisory

Since December 8, 2024, is the Second Sunday of Advent, the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception of the Blessed Virgin Mary is transferred to Monday, December 9. The obligation to attend Mass, however, does not transfer. The Optional Memorial of Saint Juan Diego Cuauhtlatoatzin, December 9, is omitted this year.
